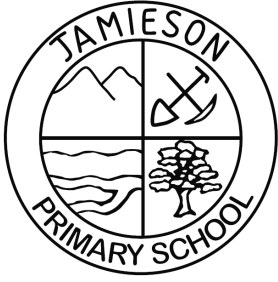

Skiometry - it's Snow Joke

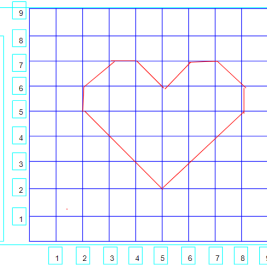

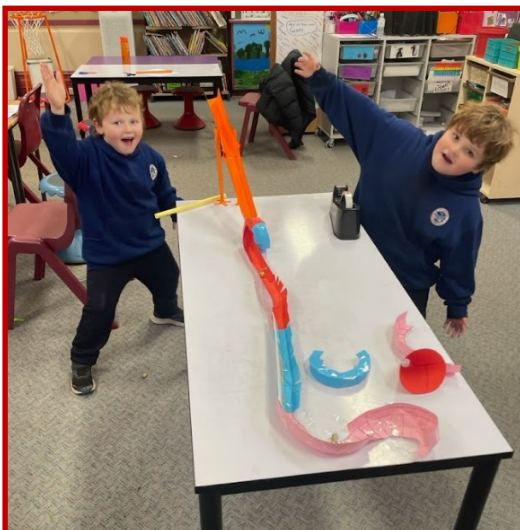
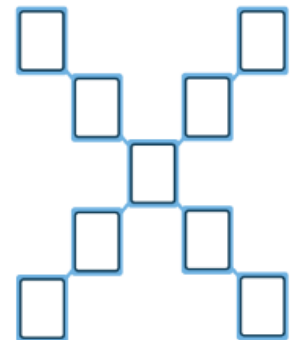
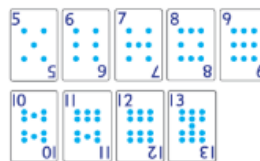
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The long awaited building works are underway!
