## Junior Room Structure Update for 2026

We would like to let our school community know about an important update to our class structure for 2026. After careful review and consultation with our SEIL, our Junior Room will operate as an F–3 learning space rather than F–2.

This change reflects the current learning needs of our students. Many of our younger learners require additional time to strengthen their foundational skills in literacy, numeracy and independent work habits. By supporting Year 3 students within the Junior Room for an extra year, we can ensure they receive the explicit teaching, targeted practice and consolidation they need before transitioning to the Senior Room.

In the Senior Room, students are expected to engage with more complex tasks and work with a higher level of independence. We want all students to feel confident and ready for this step. Adjusting the Junior Room to include Year 3 will allow us to better prepare students academically, socially and emotionally, setting them up for success as they move forward in their learning.

This decision has been made thoughtfully and collaboratively, with student wellbeing and learning at the centre. If you have any questions or would like to discuss what this change may mean for your child, please reach out at any time.

### A Note to Our New Families: Understanding Our School Reports

As we welcome new families into our school community, we'd like to share a little about our approach to student reports.

At many schools, reports are written using highly positive phrasing or "teacher speak," which can sometimes make it difficult for parents to clearly understand where their child is truly sitting. At our school, we take a different approach. We believe that honest, clear and direct communication is one of the greatest supports we can offer both students and their families.

Our reports aim to give you a genuine picture of your child's learning. They will celebrate what your child *can* do and recognise the growth they have made. They will also openly outline areas where your child needs further development. This isn't about criticism—it's about ensuring you have the information you need to understand your child's progress and how we can work together to support them.

We know that every child learns at their own pace, and honest reporting helps us tailor our teaching, set realistic goals and provide targeted support. It also helps parents feel confident that they're receiving an accurate snapshot of their child's strengths and learning needs.

We value the partnerships we have with our families, and transparent communication is central to that. If you ever have questions about your child's report or would like to discuss their learning, please know that our door is always open.
