#### Math



### JPS JOBS

Everyone gets 50 cents a day as a base wage. All the jobs are worth different wages. We negotiated these at the start of the term.

- Police, to remind people of the rules and to make sure everyone is safe. These workers can hand out values tokens. they get \$1.25 a day
- Resource manager, to manage resources and help the teacher. They get \$1.10 a day.
- Shop keeper, keeps the shop tidy and sells resources to other students and them self. The shop keeper can also do stocktake and ask the teachers to buy new resources. They get \$1.20.
- Accountant, they pay everyone the amount of money their job earned them x5 days. So, they are in charge of the bank for a week. They get \$1.50 a day.
- Health worker, they ask everyone to wash their hands and after everyone does that, they stand at the door and sanitise people when they come in after lunch. They also make sure everyone has their masks on and checks in on people to make sure they are okay. They get \$2.00 a day.
- Sports coach, for sports coach you are in charge of the sports shed and the equipment. At lunch and recess you get the key and open the shed then grab the equipment that people are requesting. You get payed \$1.50 a day.
- Groundsperson are a little bit like a police they have to make sure people don't litter and throw their rubbish everywhere. The Groundsperson gets payed \$1.25 a day.
- Unemployed is when you don't have a job but there are odd jobs that come up on the spot and you get 10c for them. You get 50c a day.

BEFORE WE STARTED WE THOURT OF THINGS WE WANTED TO PUT ON AND MOST OF THEM ARE VEGTABOLS.



*Are there any problems that you weren't expecting?*


I wasn't prepared for all the building and maintenance because I'm trained to be a teacher not a builder but thanks to Leanne and Pauline for sorting that out.
